

Median size of classes in core subjects.









Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.





Students earning a high school diploma or GED within five years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2017-18 finishing in 2021-22.





ADVANCED COURSEWORK

The Scholars Academy offers high school students numerous opportunities to challenge themselves by taking college courses at Rogue Community College and / or Southern Oregon University to earn dual high school and college credits. Scholars interested in pursuing a university education take transferable general education courses such as writing, math, science, psychology, and humanities. Scholars interested in a high demand career such as diesel mechanics, welding, electronics, or many more take courses that lead to a technical certificate.

By taking courses on the college campus, scholars learn how to interact with college instructors, access numerous available resources, and engage with like-minded teens and adults.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Students have an experience while in high school that helps them be more prepared for life after graduation. We offer students a wide variety of Career and Technical Education opportunities. In 7th grade students begin to identify and research career interests, while developing skills that will prepare them to be career ready. Students complete an in-depth Career Experience in which they have the opportunity to research, experience, and present about a specific career of their choosing. Students have access to a broad selection of career opportunities such as Industrial Arts, STEM, & robotics campus classes, college coursework and career pathways for technical certificates through RCC and SOU, industry tours, career workshops, work experience, virtual job shadows, and career fairs.
