Grading and Credit

Grades and Scoring - In order for students to receive credit for a course they must earn at least a 69.5%. Grades are rounded to the nearest whole number. Grades are awarded as follows:

A (89.5%-100%) B (79.5%-89.4%) C (69.5%-79.4%) D (59.5-69.4%) F (< 59.5)

Online Grades - Grades for online classes are cumulative. .25 credit is awarded for every 50% of a semester course completed. Final grades and credit are awarded by the Lead Instructor of that content area.

Portfolios - Students using approved textbooks for their core classes will submit a portfolio once per quarter to the Lead Instructor of that content area. Portfolio requirements, expectations, and pacing guides will be handed out at the start of the grading period. Portfolios submitted late will incur a grading penalty of 5% for every day it is late, up to 5 days. After the 5 days it will receive a failing grade and must be resubmitted at the next grading period for full credit.

Planned Courses of Study - Planned Courses of Study (PCS) will be developed at the beginning of the grading period by the Education Specialist, Learning Coach, and Student. PCS will include objectives to be met, content to be covered, grading expectations, and curriculum and activities used to teach knowledge and skills. The PCS must be approved by the Lead Instructor in the specific content area, and/or the teacher of record.

Retrieving Credit - Students wishing to retrieve credit for courses taken previously will be required to test out of the course using one of Logos' approved online programs. Depending on the program, students will either: A). Take the cumulative exam of an entire course. The grade associated with the credit earned will be the grade from the exam. Students may also choose to receive a P or Pass for their grade. B). Students will take individual unit tests to test out of portions of the course. Students will then complete the any units that were not passed in their entirety. Students have one opportunity to take these tests as they are designed to demonstrate mastery of content. The grade earned will be the cumulative grade once all units are completed.

Credit for Proficiency - Students having previous experience with Language Arts content through traditional homeschooling that has not been previously added to a High School transcript may receive up to .5 Language Arts credit by placing into Reading 115 and Writing 121 on the RCC Accuplacer test.
